



Halloween Bat Magnet

Materials

- 1 Kunin CraftCut 9" x 12" ClassicFelt™ in Black
- 1 Kunin CraftCut 9" x 12" ClassicFelt™ in Violet Sky
- 9" x 12" Lite Steam-A-Seam 2" iron on adhesive
- ½" x 4" Magnetic strip
- Lavender and black embroidery floss
- 3" x 7" Green print fabric
- 6 Green buttons, ½"
- 2 Wiggle eyes, 10mm

Tools & Notions

Pins, Scissors, Needles, Iron, Permanent Fabric Glue (I use Fabri Tac Glue or other permanent glue that doesn't seep into the fabric.)

Notes

When using the iron-on adhesive, follow manufacturer's directions and use the release paper as a pressing cloth between the felt and the iron. Do not iron directly onto the felt.

Instructions

1. Iron a 3" x 7" piece of iron-on adhesive onto the black felt. Cut out 1 bat using the pattern piece.
2. Iron a 3" x 7" piece of iron-on adhesive onto the back of the print fabric. Cut out 2, 1" x 7" strips of print fabric.
3. Cut out 2, 3" x 6½" violet sky pieces of felt.
4. Iron the strips of the fabric onto the front of the violet sky felt as shown.
5. Iron the bat in place on the front of the black felt over the fabric strips.
6. With 3 strands of black embroidery floss, blanket-stitch along the edges of the fabric strips, top and bottom.
7. Blanket-stitch around the bat with 3 strands of lavender embroidery floss. Stitch a smile on the face of the bat. Stitch the 6 buttons to the wings of the bat as shown.
8. Glue the wiggle eyes in place. Cut out 2 black eyelids using the pattern piece and then glue them in place.
9. Iron a 3" x 6½" piece of iron-on adhesive onto the remaining 3" x 6½" Violet Sky felt piece. Iron the front and back of the bat banner together. Blanket-stitch around the outside edge of the bat banner with 3 strands of the lavender embroidery floss.
10. Glue the magnet to the back top of the bat banner.
